Since 2015 I have been creating work in The Female Power Project, which has expanded into several bodies of work: perSISTERS prints and ephemera; Shawls, Scarves, and Garments; Nasty RZY prints, embroideries, and ephemera; and one-of-a-kind sculptural assemblages and collages. My primary occupation is selling Female Power Project works directly at markets and festivals.
